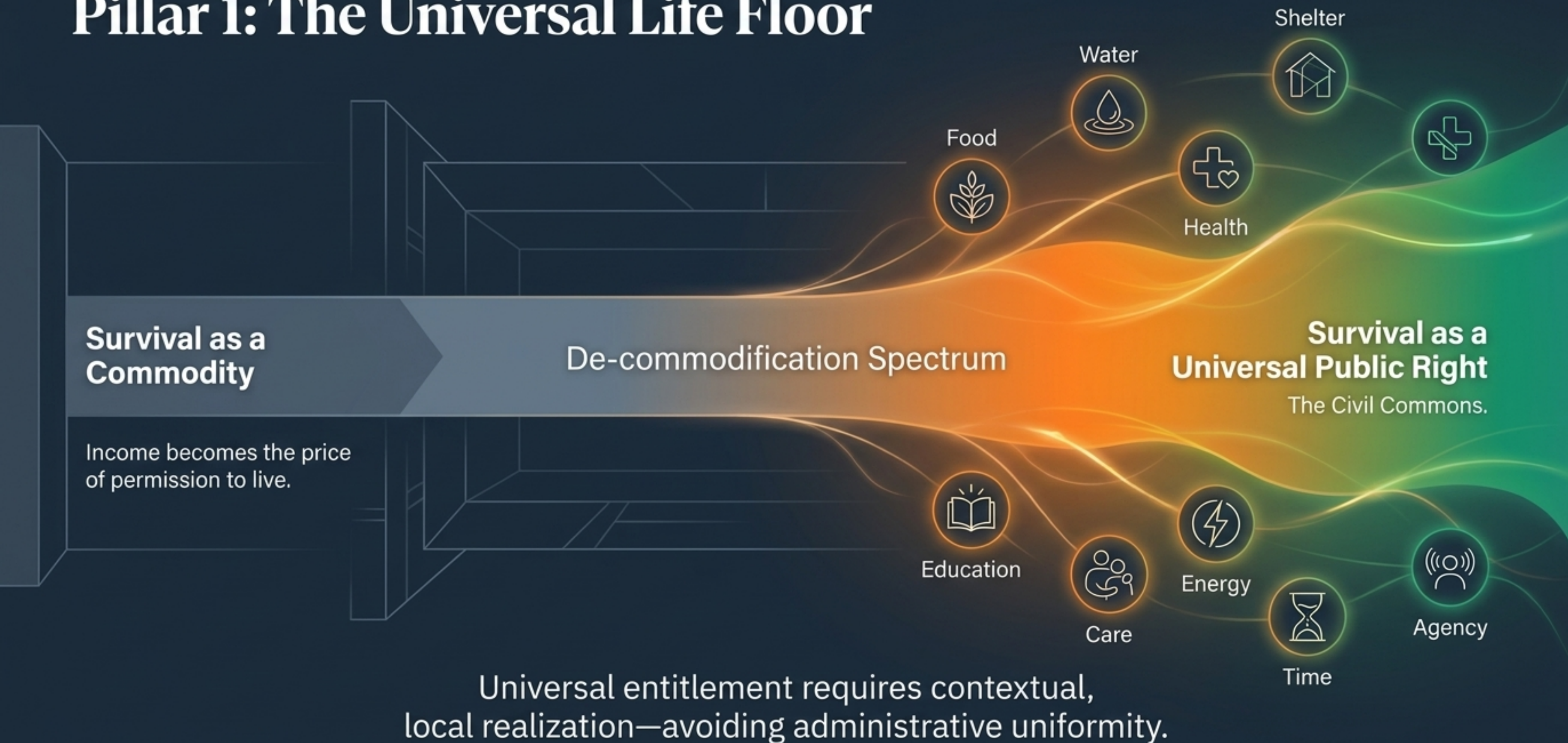

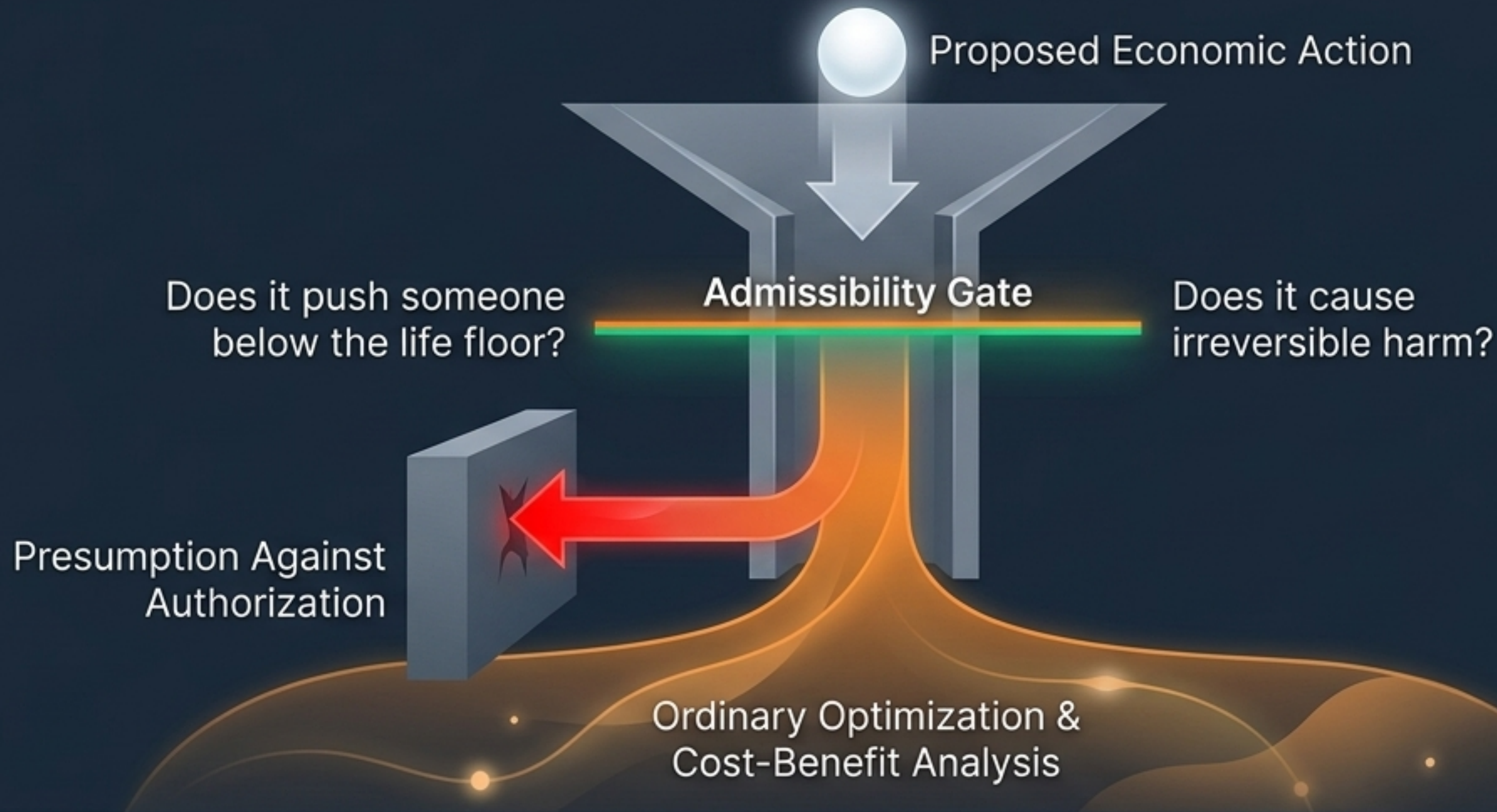

Pillar 1: The Universal Life Floor



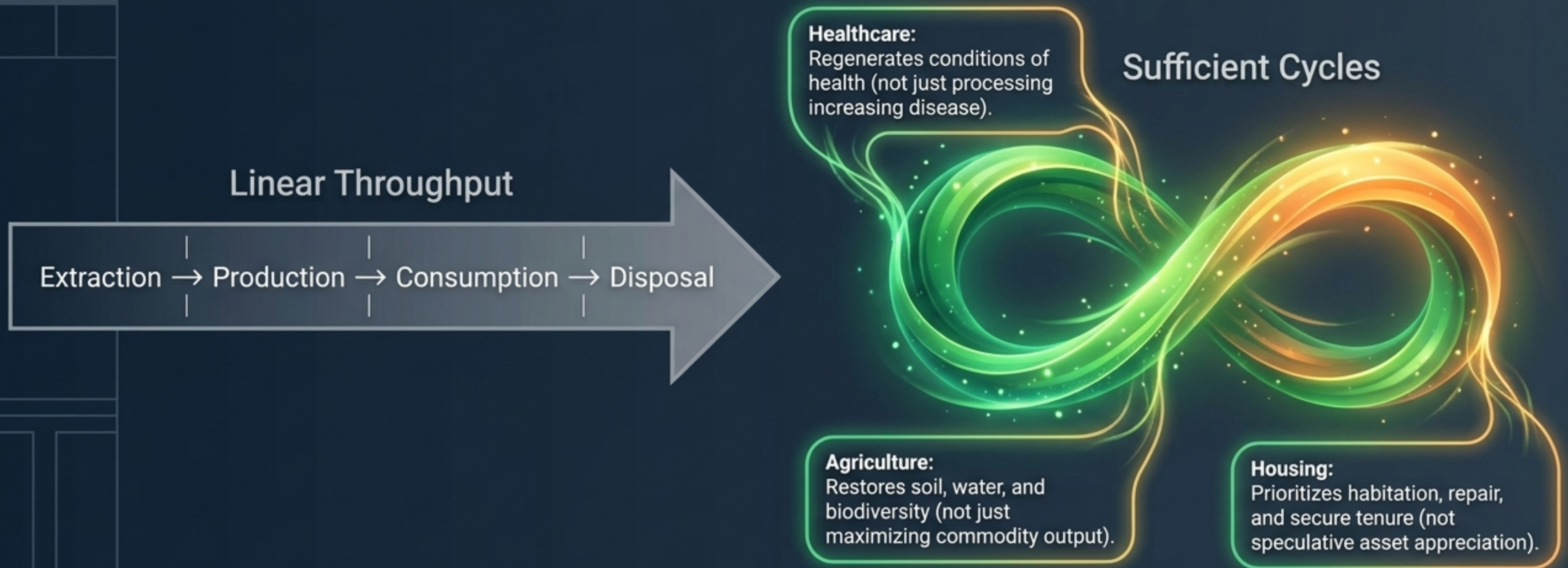
Pillar 2: The Principle of Non-Sacrifice

No population or ecosystem may be systematically deprived of indispensable conditions of life for aggregate economic or ecological benefit.

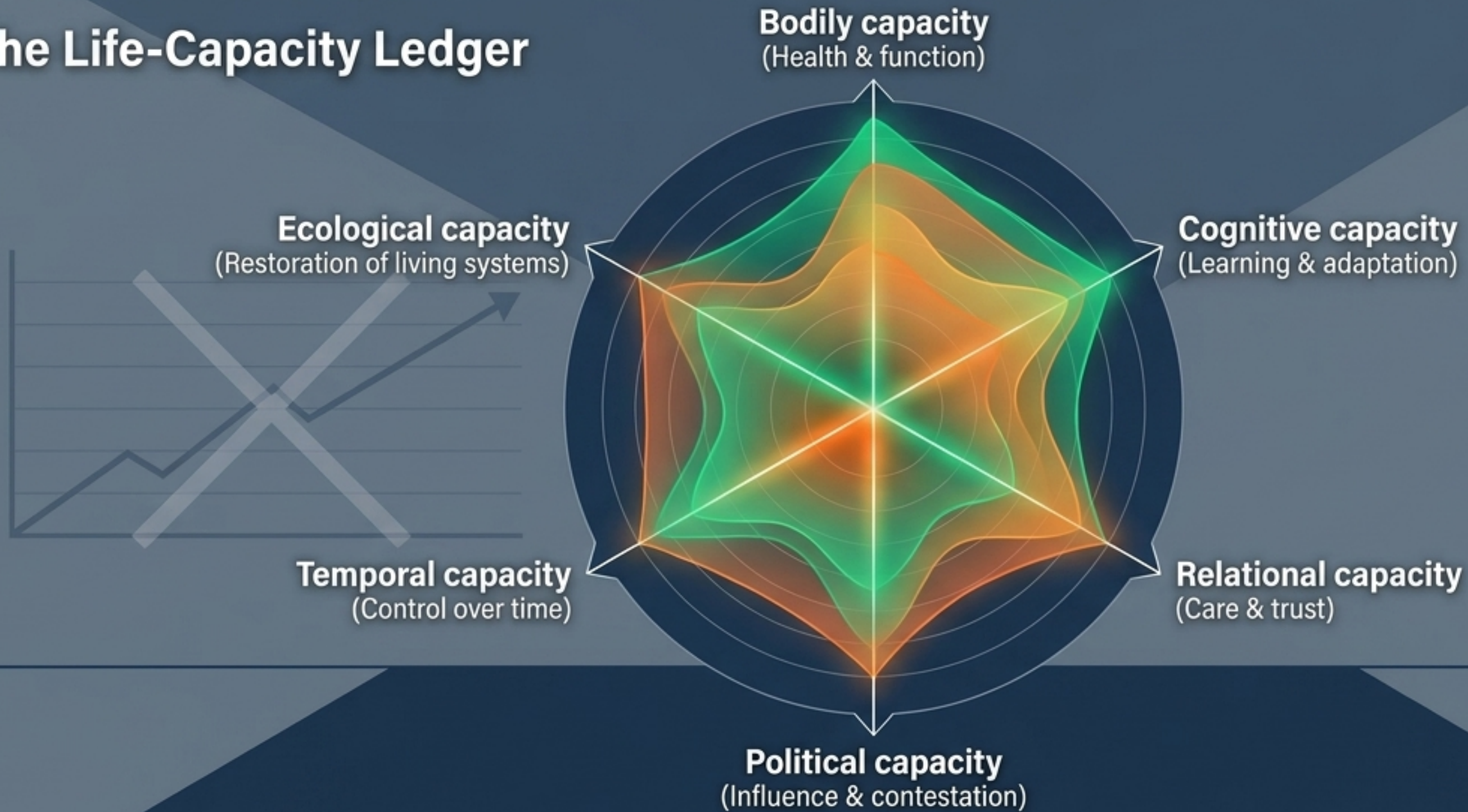
Pillar 3: Regenerative Provisioning



A genuine surplus exists only where present provision does not diminish the capacity for future provision.

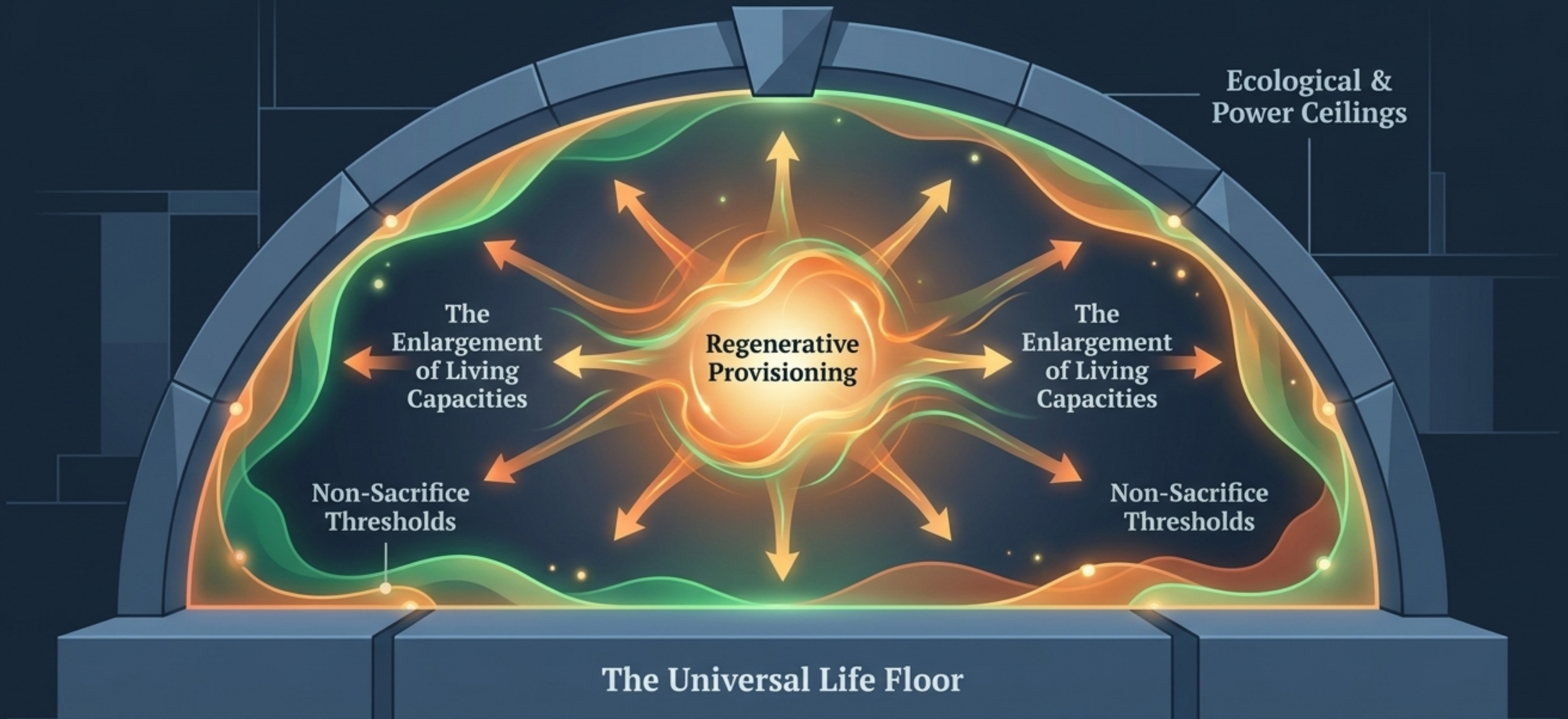

The Life-Capacity Ledger



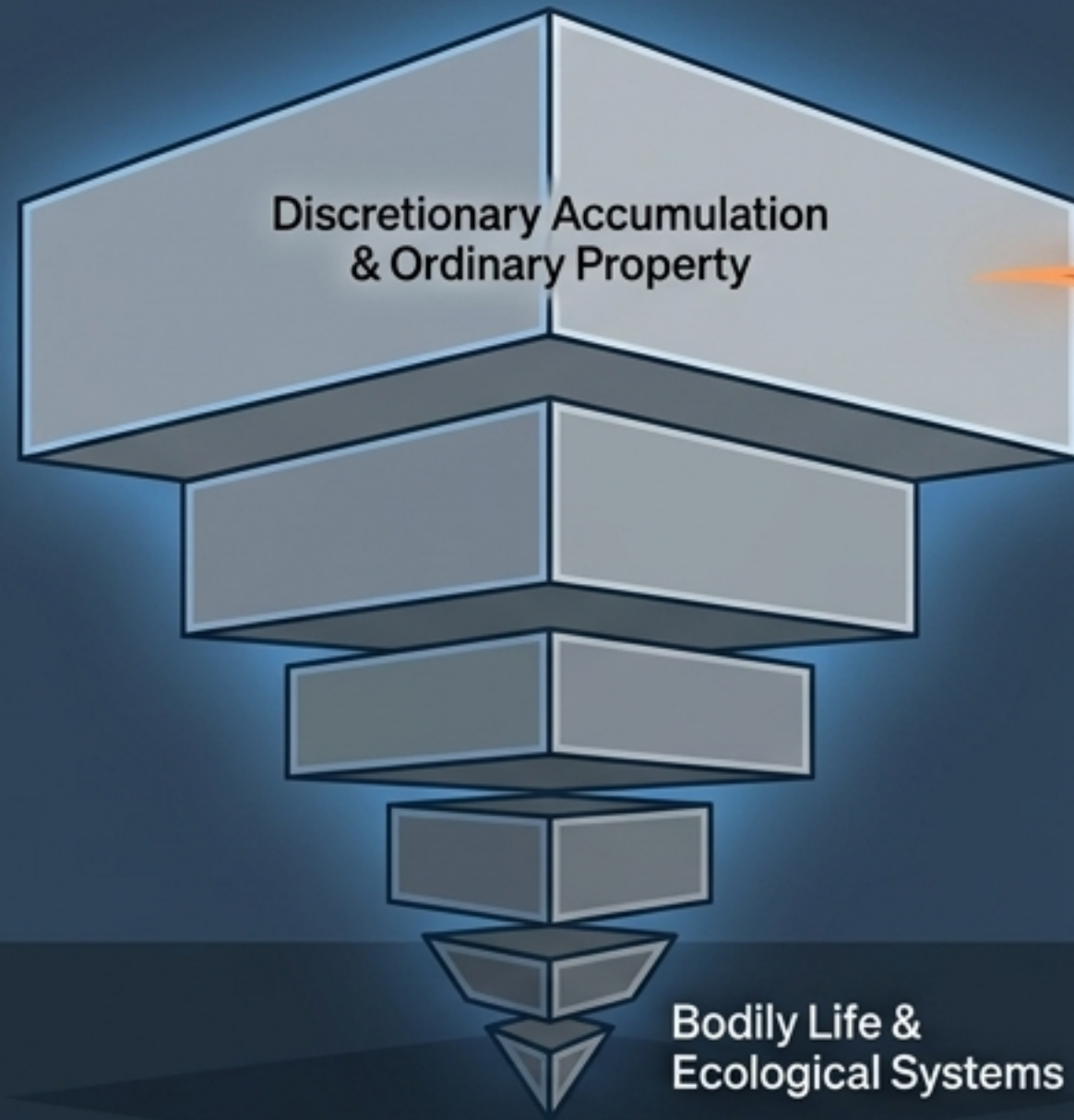

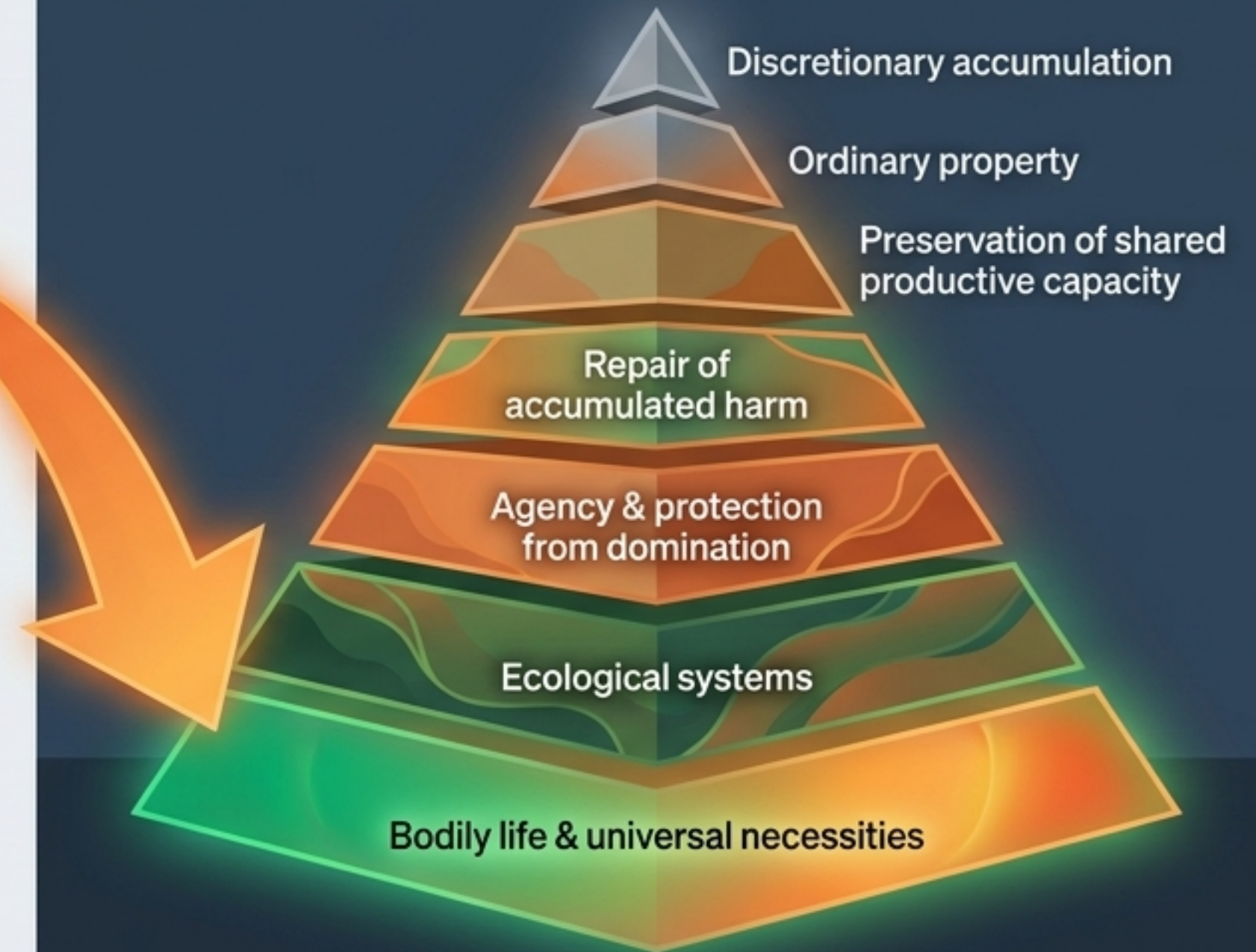


The Hierarchical Inversion

(adjusted for historical repair and vulnerability)

UN Central Bank

Democratic Monetary Commons

(coordinating real resources, not preserving creditor hierarchy)



Authority must sit at the lowest level capable of governing the consequences. Higher levels prevent transboundary harm and redistribute capacity.

**Subsidiarity without solidarity
abandons the vulnerable.
Solidarity without subsidiarity
becomes central domination.**

The purpose of economic and political institutions is not the endless reproduction of money, markets, or states. It is the democratic protection, restoration, and enlargement of the conditions and capacities of life.

A just world is not one in which every person receives a fairer share of an unchanged system. It is one in which no population is rendered disposable.
