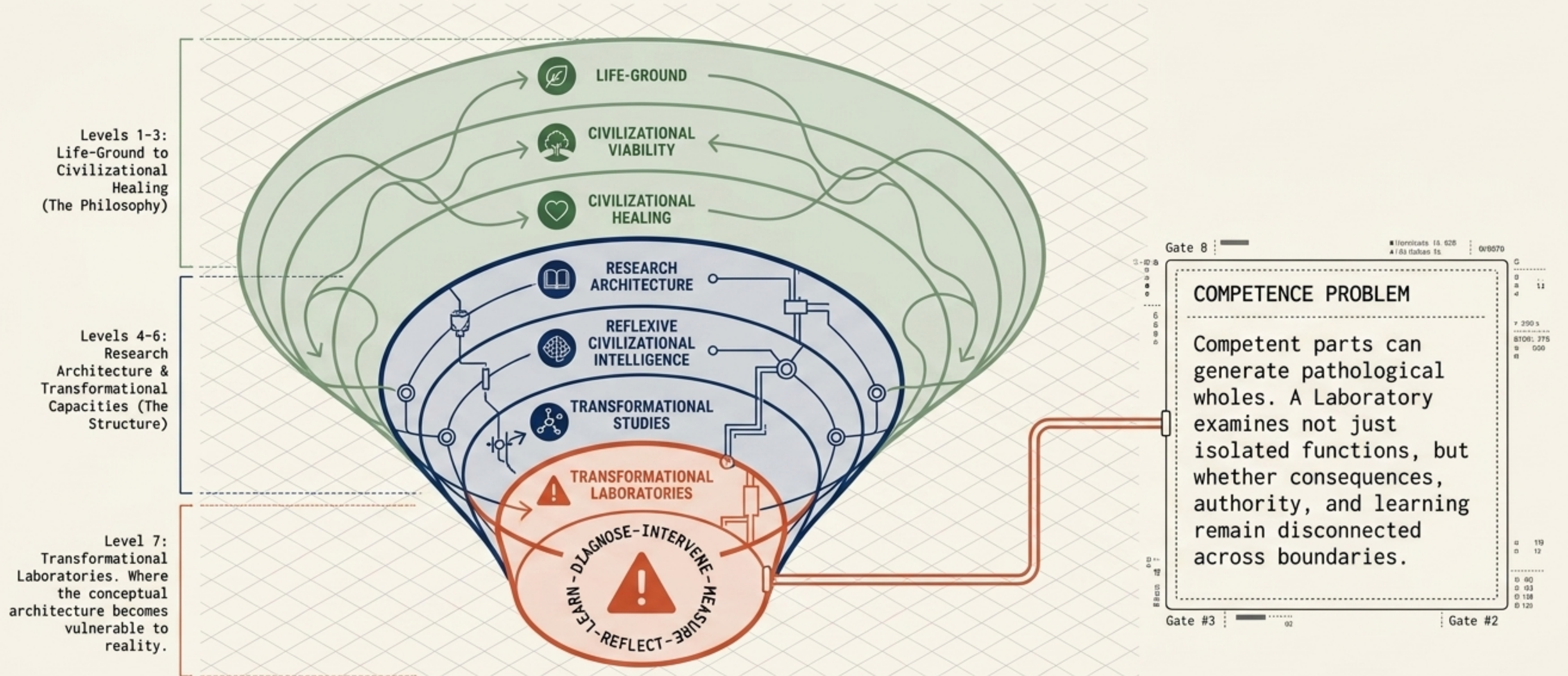

The Threshold From Theory to Praxis



Defining the Bounded Inquiry

A bounded, governed, real-world inquiry where affected communities and institutions jointly test whether a specified change reduces organized life-disconnection without reproducing domination.

BOUNDED

Explicit perimeter of place, power, and data.

PROTECTIVE

Margins and remedies precede intervention.

CO-GOVERNED

Affected constituencies possess real authority.

CORRIGIBLE

Consequences can alter theory and action.

What it is NOT

- ✗ A pilot with predetermined success.
- ✗ A population treated as an experimental object.
- ✗ An innovation sandbox exempt from accountability.
- ✗ Therapy for 'defective' people or cultures.

The Protocol in Twelve Commitments

[1-3]



Quadrant 1: Authority & Power

- Affected people possess authority (shape frames, burdens, remedies).
- Power is treated as causal (mapped and counterweighted).
- AI remains assistive and non-sovereign.

[4-6]



Quadrant 2: Protection & Boundaries

- Protection precedes intervention (usable margins funded first).
- Action is bounded; observation is permeable.
- Least-dominating effective means governs action.

[7-9]



Quadrant 3: Inquiry & Epistemics

- Reality before confirmation (null findings change theory).
- No single score defines healing.
- Independent review can pause or stop.

[10-12]



Quadrant 4: Consequence & Corrigibility

- Living coordination is a readiness condition.
- Repair follows harm and breach.
- Every cycle sunsets (scaling requires new authorization).

The Affective-Relational Substrate

Living Coordination is the recurrent, power-aware capacity to preserve dignity, surface conflict truthfully, and coordinate care across difference without coercive assimilation.

What it is

TRUTHFUL_CONFLICT:

Truthful Conflict

(Disagreement reaches decision-makers)

POSITIVE_PEACE:

Positive Peace

(Direct and structural harms decline)

RECIPROCAL_CARE:

Reciprocal Care

(Needs defined with affected people)

POWER_AWARE:

Power-Aware

(Counterweights to sponsor power)

What it is NOT

NOT_HARMONY:

Not Harmony

(Anger/refusal are valid)

NOT_COERCIVE_CIVILITY:

Not Coercive Civility

(No tone-policing justified anger)

NOT_COMPULSORY_TRUST:

Not Compulsory Trust

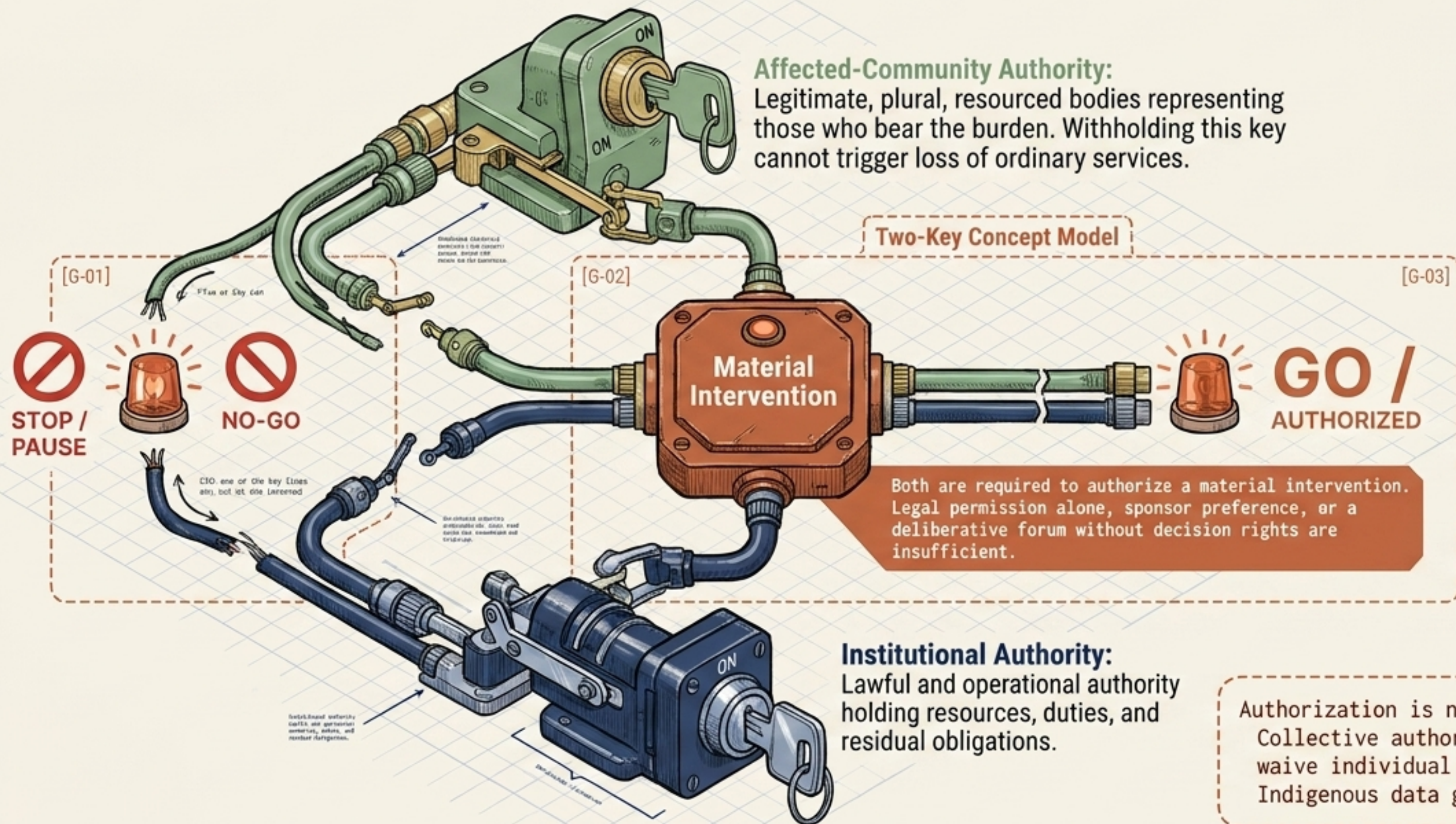
(Institutions must prove trustworthiness)

NOT_THERAPY:

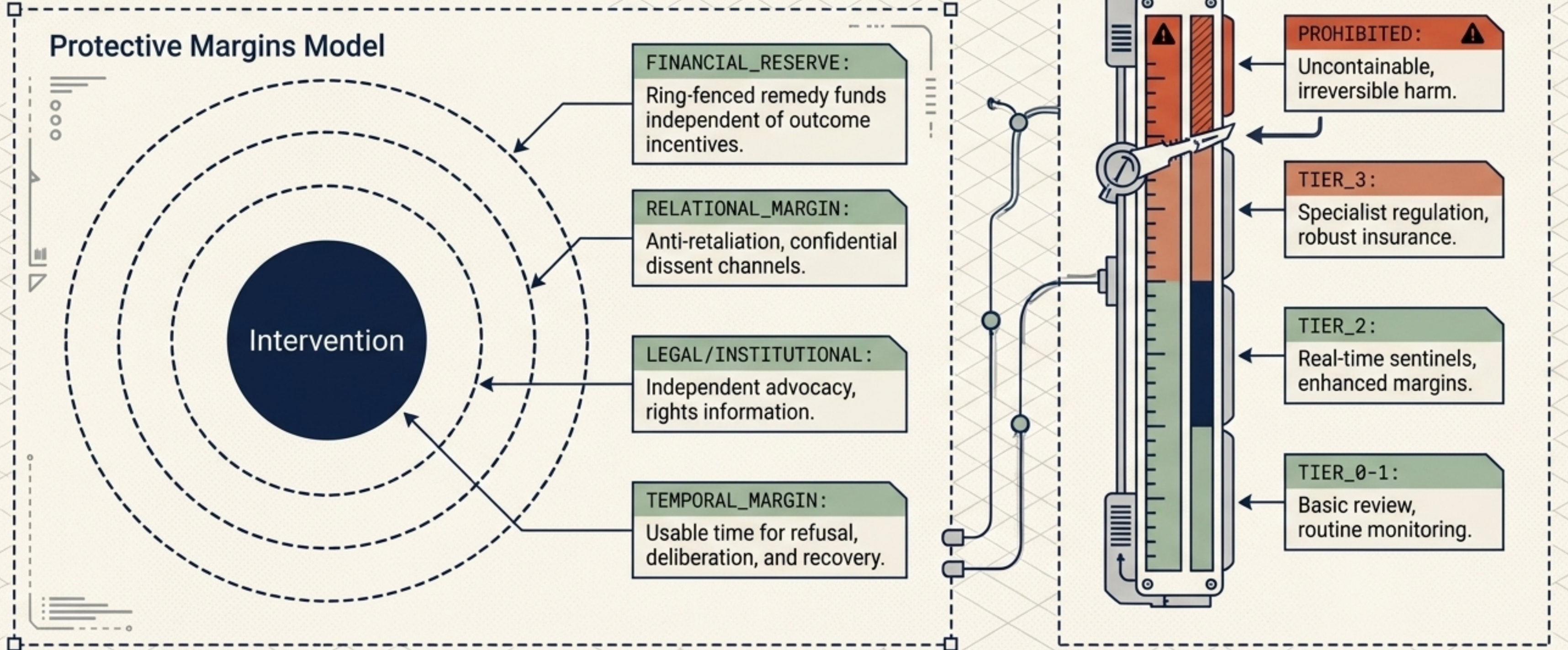
Not Therapy

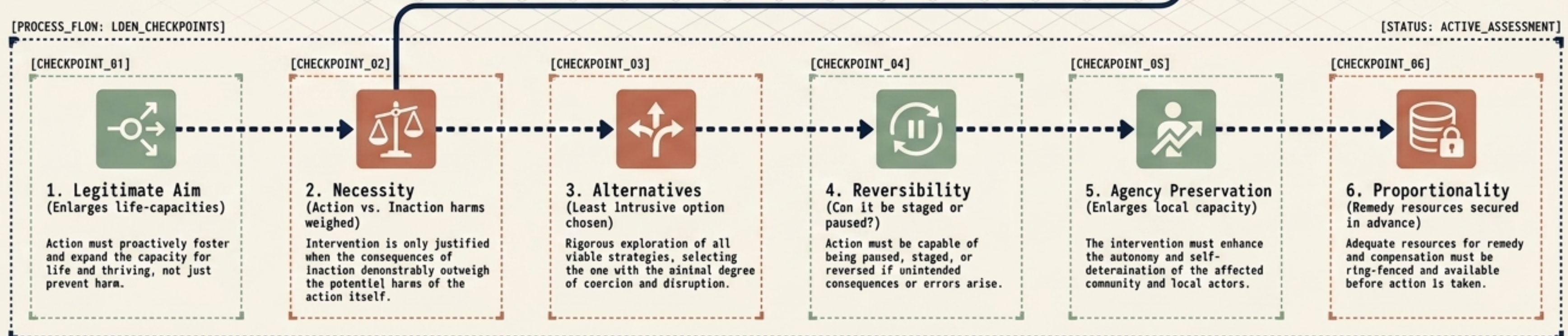
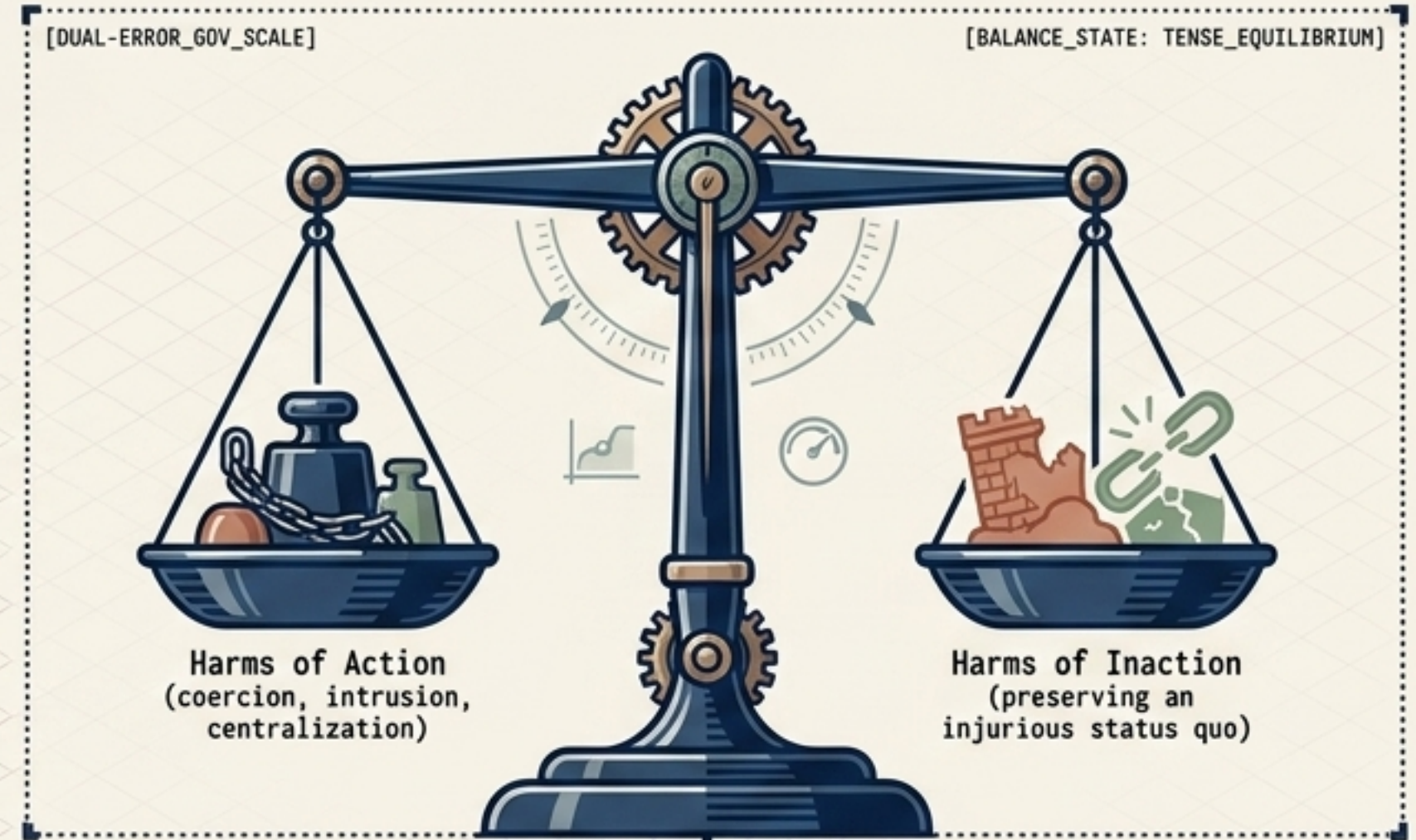


Protection Precedes Intervention



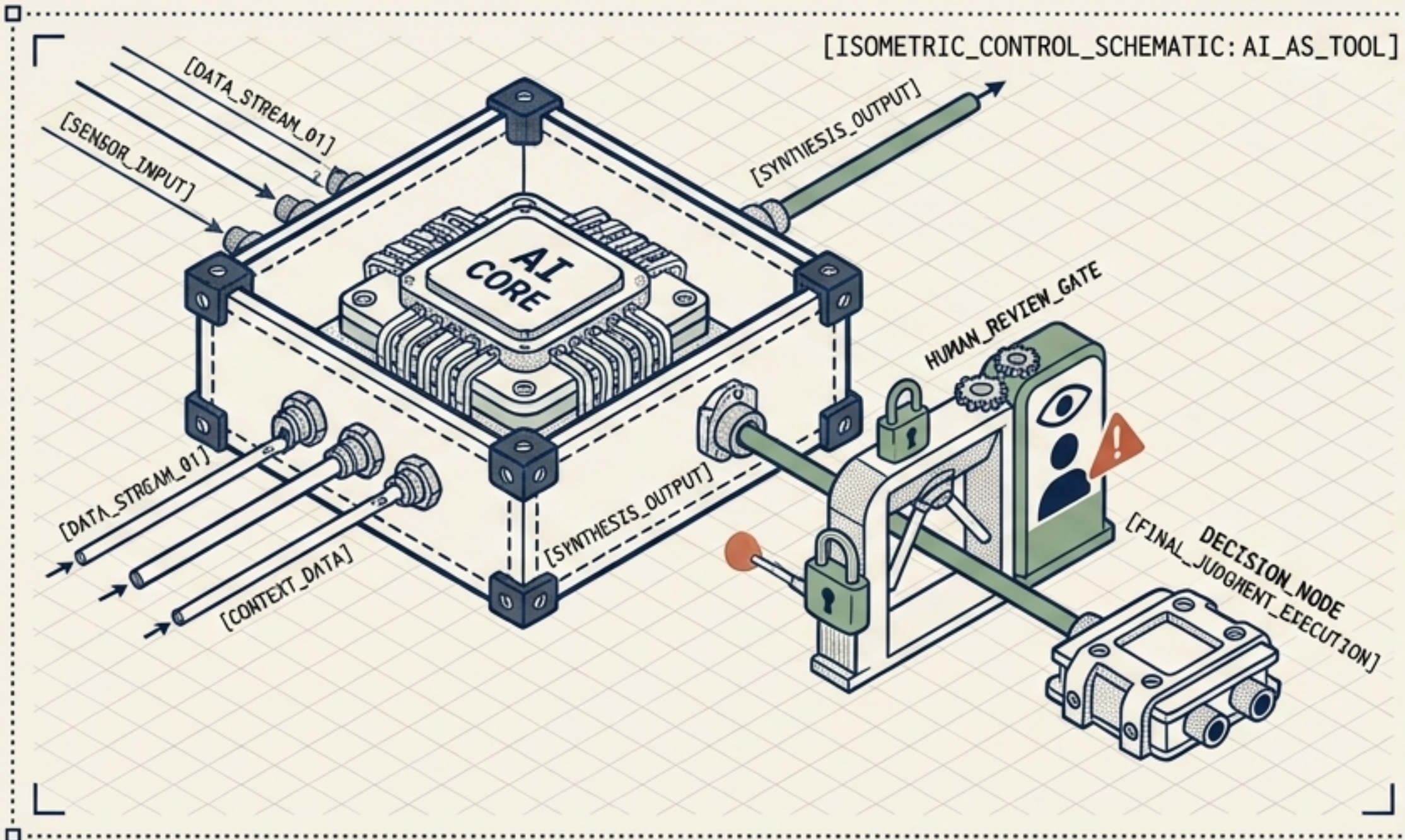
The Least-Dominating Effective Means

Action must minimize coercion without protecting an injurious status quo.



AI Capability Without Machine Sovereignty

AI may assist synthesis, pattern detection, and scenario modeling.
It **MUST** remain embedded, augmentative, and non-sovereign.

THE FIREWALLS



AI MUST NOT:

- ❌ **[DETERMINE]**: Consent, legitimacy, or acceptable burdens.
[RULE_01_CONSENT_BLOCK]
- ❌ **[ADJUDICATE]**: Grievances or decide continuation/termination.
[RULE_02_ADJUDICATION_BLOCK]
- ❌ **[INFER]**: Credibility or relational safety from biometrics.
[RULE_03_INFER_BLOCK]
- ❌ **[SERVE]**: As the sole evidence for a causal judgment.

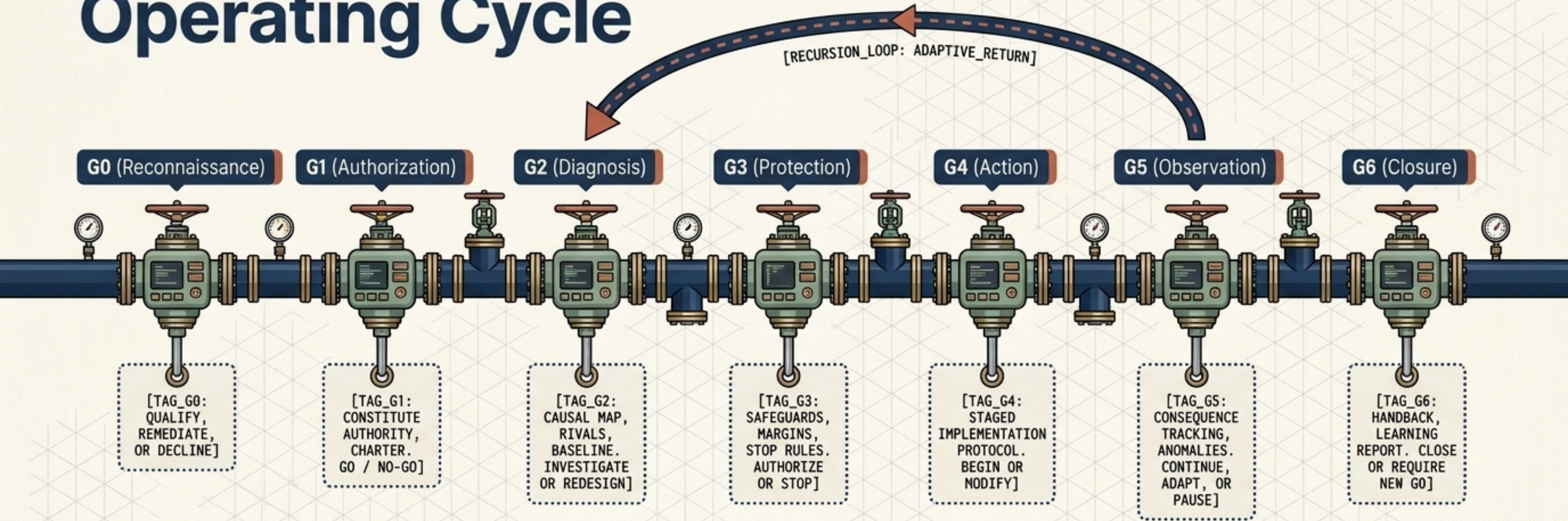
Every consequential use requires source traceability, independent human review, and a non-AI path for appeal.

RECURSION WARNING: `[PHASES_ARE_NON_LINEAR]`. Recognition, protection, and diagnosis recur whenever boundaries change or harm appears.

Anatomy of a Minimum Viable Laboratory

Minimal refers to scale, duration, and intervention intensity—never to diluted legitimacy, safeguards, or evidence integrity.

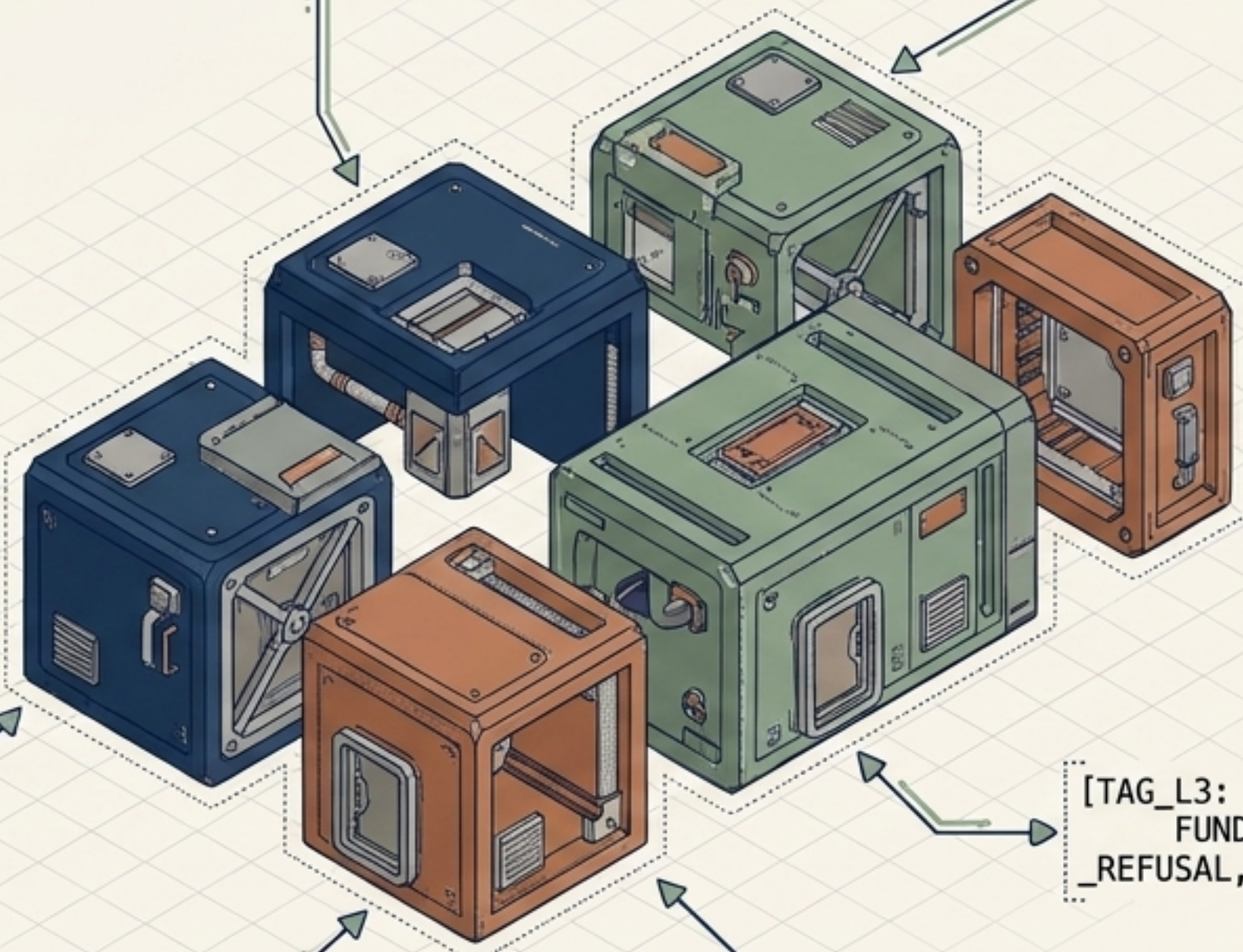

The Evidence Cube

Core Principle:

No single score defines healing. An aggregate can conceal thresholds, subgroup deterioration, and transferred burdens.

Scale (Y):

Person → Group → Institution →
Community → Ecosystem.

Time (X):

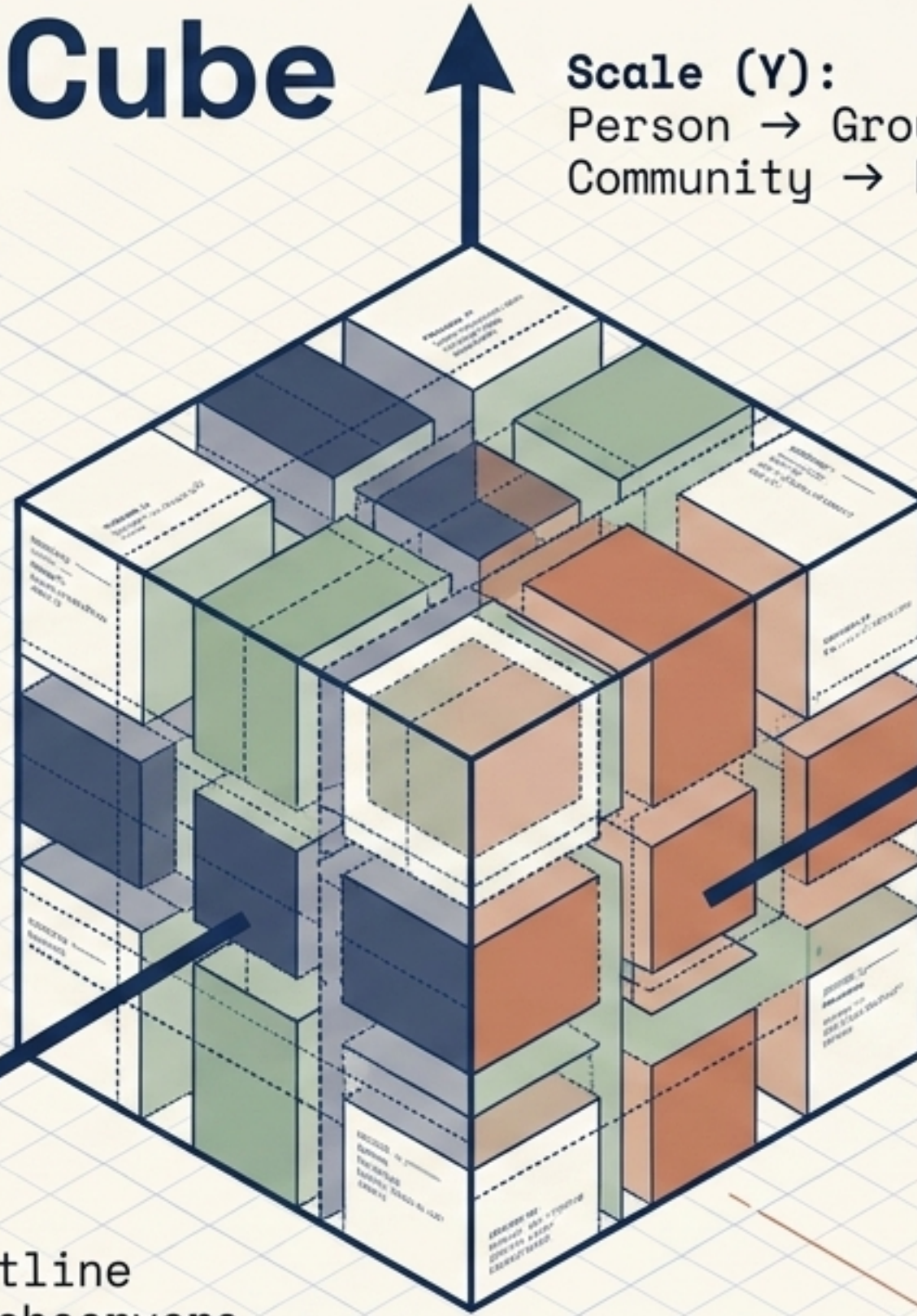
Baseline → Intervention

Perspective (Z):

workers, independent observers,
biophysical evidence.

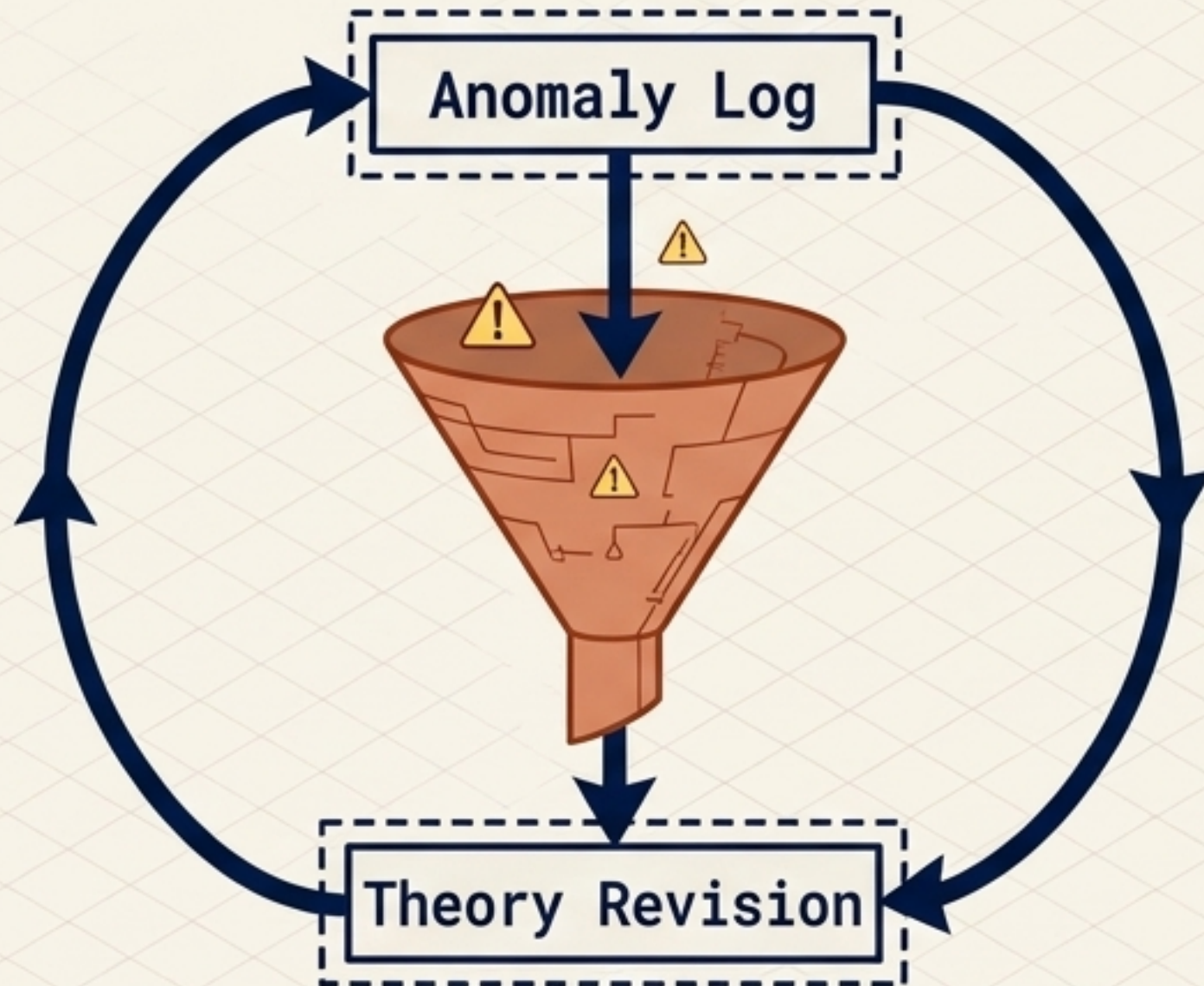
Interpretation Rule:

Falsification & Corrigibility

Precommitment: Register bounded claims, mechanisms, rivals, and thresholds before exposure begins to prevent moving goalposts.

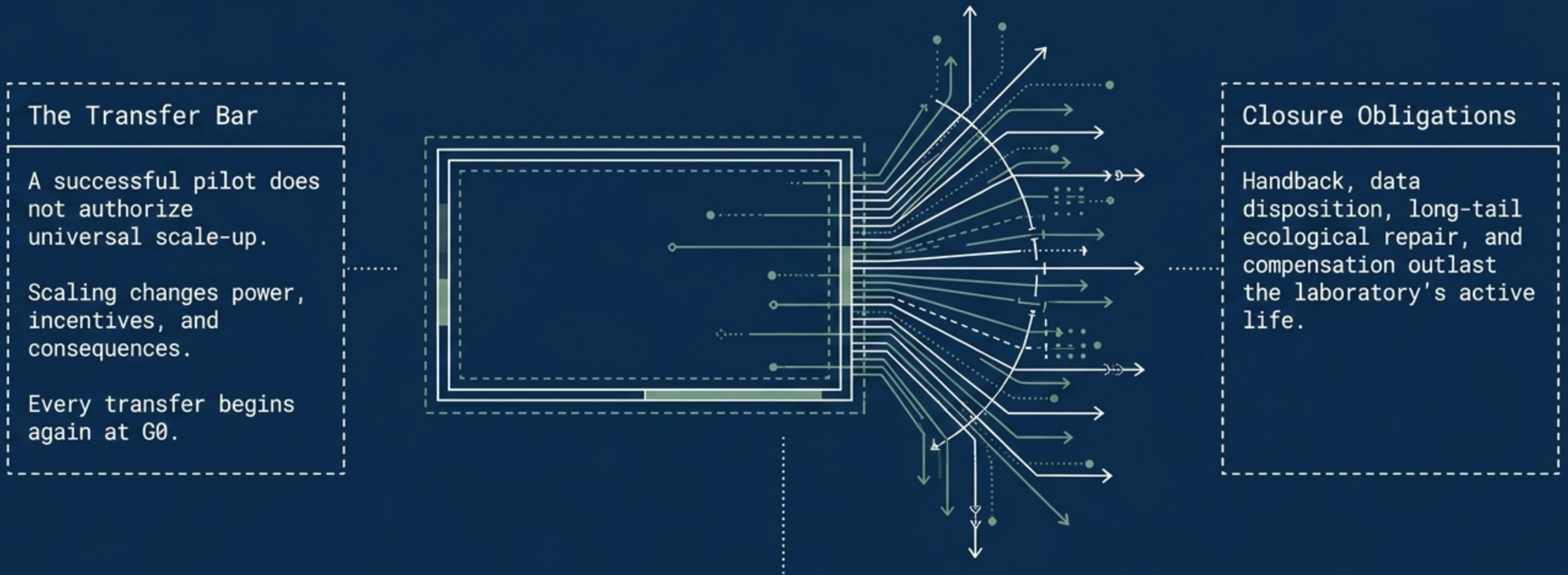


Conditions for Falsification: Substantial revision is warranted when:

- Predicted mechanisms remain absent despite adequate implementation.
- Rival explanations fit the evidence more adequately.
- Benefits consistently depend on coercion or loss of contestability.
- Aggregate improvement conceals serious subgroup deterioration.
- Local gains arise through spatial, ecological, or intergenerational burden transfer.

The Corrigibility Test: A theory of healing that cannot itself learn contradicts its own foundations.

Responsible Closure & Sunset



Can a bounded setting become more capable of recognizing its injuries, protecting the exposed, completing repair, and learning sufficiently to change what it does next—without creating a new center of domination?
